### INTRODUCTION

The following responsive readings are designed for corporate use on Sunday mornings, except for the ones marked "family prayers" (these can be used corporately but are designed for home use).

The readings are provided in this format for ease of integration with projection software. Please include copyright information with each reading in your system. However, if projecting and including the copyright information, please feel free to make it small enough (or put it out of the way so it doesn't distract).

You can also feel free to design and print the readings in a beautiful way for handing out in bulletins, mailings, etc.

Included below are 11 complete readings and one family reading guide, with their designated uses. You can mix and match as needed to work with Advent candles or other service requirements.

These readings are all for use in worship for your congregation. You can use them live or in your online services, on slides, presentation software, etc. Note: Please resist the urge to post the text versions of the readings on the public internet (i.e. websites, social media pages, etc.) for copyright reasons. Thanks for understanding.

You can also print or email a PDF of the Family Prayers and Reading Guide to families in your congregation if desired. I would simply ask you create a PDF of those prayers if emailing, so they can print them easily, and so that the copyright information is attached.

Note that in the readings the word "Celebrant" is used for the Leader, and "Community" is used for those responding. You may choose to change those words to "Leader" and "Congregation" if desired, or something like it.

Blessings to you this Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany season! It's the "Cycle of Light" in the Christian Year calendar, and it's a beautiful time to celebrate our Savior's coming.

Celebrant: In this first week of Advent, we pray with believers around the world.

Community: Come Lord Jesus, come.

ALL: Lord, we prepare the ground of our hearts for this Advent season. Once again, we reclaim Your work within us and in Your world, to make all things new. The story of Advent reminds us that when You come there is transformation and healing. You transformed lives then, You transform our lives now, and You will transform all things on the Day of Your return. We look forward to this great Day when all creation will be made new.

Community: Jesus, Lord, save and rescue us from the sting of death and the grip of sin.

Celebrant: In this second week of Advent, we pray with believers around the world.

Community: Saving Lord, intervene in this good world and restore all things to Your original purpose.

ALL: Lord, we recognize that You are the God who draws near to Your creation. You are not far, not distant, not oblivious to our needs. Come, save us from our enemies within and without, rescue us from the idolatries of our age, and renew our voice to sing once again of Your saving power in our world.

Community: The day of Your incarnation is near!

Celebrant: There is no social ill, relational breach, nor systemic evil that will not dissolve at Your touch.

Community: The day of Your incarnation is near!

Celebrant: In this third week of Advent, we sing with the prophets.

Community: That One will come who will bring the shalom peace of God to all human conditions!

Celebrant: In this third week of Advent, we shout with the children.

Community: Prince of Peace, quiet a world screaming in pain, and hungry for your Presence!

Celebrant: In this third week of Advent, we pray with believers around the world.

Community: Master of hearts, bring harmony to the discord between us and those unlike us!

ALL: Prince of Peace, we recognize that You are the God who alone can bring restoration to a fallen planet. Your capacity to restore broken relationships, communities, nations, and ancient rivalries is boundless. Come, restore peace to our hearts today, and intervene among our restless human family. Lord, make us instruments of this same transforming peace wherever we go.

We prepare our hearts in this Advent season by praying, listening, singing, and responding to Your restoring forgiveness. With the ancients who awaited You, we say "Prince of Peace, plant the seeds of Your coming restoration in our hearts. After Your likeness, make us your Peacemakers."

Celebrant: In this fourth week of Advent, we shout with the children.

Community: King of the Universe, dwell in our midst and teach us the ways of Your Everlasting Kingdom.

Celebrant: In this fourth week of Advent, we pray with believers around the world.

Community: Ruler of Heaven and Earth, sovereignly act to restore loving leadership among those who bear Your image.

ALL: King of the Ages, we are broken in our understanding of loving leadership, and have lost the capacity to understand the ways of a benevolent Sovereign. Show us Your face, teach us your ways, elevate the law of Love among us, and help us to receive Your Guidance on our ashamed planet.

We prepare our hearts in this Advent season by praying, listening, singing, and responding to Your Rightful Kingship in our lives and in Your world. With the ancients who awaited You, we say “King of Kings and Lord of Lords, come quickly to us, right Your world, and spark the dawn of New Creation.”

Celebrant: The family (and friends) gathered around this tree, and the stories we share together, remind us that You have been faithful to us for generations – and You will be faithful for generations to come.

Family (and friends): Joy to the World! The Lord has come!

Celebrant: Let's join hands (all join hands). Lord Jesus, because of Christmas, we can be made new by Your Spirit who lives in us. You are the reason we give these gifts, and You are the reason we live our lives. May this Christmas Day remind us of all You have given; we give you on the day of Your earthly birth, the best gift we can give - our lives.

In Jesus name, our Immanuel, we say,

ALL: Joy to the World! The Lord has come!

## TITLE: A Christmas Reading Guide for Families

If desired, the following passages work well for reading through the Christmas story as a family. Consider having different family members read an entire section, or portions of a section. In our home, we use a Nativity set and act out the scenes.

### The Christmas Story

Luke 1:26-38

(The Angel visits Mary, Mary's response, the Magnificat - Mary's song of worship)

Matthew 1:18-25 or Luke 2:1-7

(Matthew: The engagement, Joseph's dream; Luke: Census and short birth narrative)

Luke 2:8-20

(The Shepherds see the Angelic Host)

Matthew 2:1-12

(The Wise Men come from the East)

John 1:1-15

(In the beginning was the Word...; consider memorizing this passage as a family one year)

### SECTION III: THE NEW YEAR

TITLE: A Fresh Vision Before Us

SUBTITLE: A New Year Prayer

Living God, Restoring Son, and Transforming Spirit,
